UPDATE ON PROJECTS

Our **Comfort Pack Project** has increased with additional centres we support such as Netcare hospitals over South Africa and various other centres outside Gauteng. We are excited about our Comfort Pack Project reaching other provinces as well. *With the Festive Season around the corner we aim on packing 1000 packs to double supply all centres during this time when, sadly, crime is higher. Anyone who wants to get involved or donate, please let me know.* We have distributed 6733 bags since January, adding the 1000 we are currently busy with will bring our total to 7733. We expect this figure to go up for 2016 with the addition of more centres who have approached us for assistance.

Our **Fairy Godmother Project** was mainly aimed at girls as we just did not get in any donations for the boys. We were absolutely thrilled when we received a call from **Bride&Co** advising that they have suits available to donate to us through **Eurosuits**. We received a massive delivery and it has been such a fantastic experience being able to assist the boys as well. The children who do not have financial means to get an outfit and know they might not be able to attend due to this, go through tremendous stress at a time when they should focus on schoolwork. Being able to assist them and allow them this opportunity makes a big difference to them. This year we have dressed 413 children for their matric farewell – making it possible for them to attend. We still have approximately 30 more children to dress before year end.

Our **Step-Up Project** – we have been struggling a bit to get this project off the ground due to a few reasons. Computer equipment donated is unfortunately very old and not in working condition. It is, at times, difficult to get the shelter ladies to our offices as most of these shelters in the province do struggle with

transport. We have unfortunately not been able to secure transport for the Epic Foundation to date. We do therefore have a request for donations of laptops which will allow us to take our training to the shelters.

With the growth in our projects we ran out of space in our offices and managed to move into much larger premises on 13 September 2015. We would like to give a special thanks to **Elliot Mobility** for sponsoring the move for us. We appreciate your support.

NEW DEVELOPMENTS

Charities4Change



In January this year the Epic Foundation together with Renay Bunke took over the charity networking organisation Charities4Change from our friend Karen Landi from Community Hours SA. This is a charity networking organisation where our aim is to bring organisation together every 6 weeks in an effort for us to share what we do, what our needs are and what our challenges are. The purpose of this is to encourage organisations to support each other.

We are now taking a further step in the process in inviting CSR representatives from various organisations to attend these functions as well. This will give Corporates an opportunity to share with NPO's what they are looking for when they are approached by NGO's and also an opportunity for Corporates to see what NPO's are available in the community and what our needs are. The first corporate to attend our function at the end of October was **PricewaterhouseCoopers**.

AVON *Justine*


- The Avon/Justine walkathon for Breast Cancer on 25 October where we had a display stall

BEYOND PAINTING CLASSROOMS CONFERENCE



NEEDS OF THE EPIC FOUNDATION

- **COMFORT PACK PROJECT:** We are looking for sponsors for bags we use as our current stock of brand new beach bags are running out. We are also asking for donations of fabric as we have an old age home and other individuals assisting with draw string bags for the kiddie packs. **We do of course always have a need for the content items - full list are available on our website.**
- **FAIRY GODMOTHER PROJECT:** If you do know of any children in need of matric farewell outfits please do refer them to us. **It is important for us to have people out there helping us get word out.** We always accept all evening dresses, suits, etc. We are in need of the following:
 - evening jewellery and bags
 - larger size dresses
 - cufflinks and shoes for the boys
 - Cupboards – ideally the large two door steel ones – to pack our outfits for the boys into
 - Clothing rails for both the suits and evening dresses
 - Hangers
- **STEP –UP PROJECT:** We are asking for any donations of laptop computers for our training centre which will also allow us to take training to the shelters.
- **TRANSPORT:** We have not been successful on various proposals to obtain a **sponsored car** for the Epic Foundation. Transport is a problem as we are unable to get to all the places where we need to – some centres we support also struggle with transport and cannot always get to us. We are asking for volunteers who could possibly assist with transport. In the event that anyone has a contact at a dealerships we can approach for assistance, please do let us know.
- **PREMISES:** Our premises where we are running our projects from are vital. As we do have a lease and we do pay a monthly rental we do require **funding to assist us with these payments.** We often get funding from corporates but are requested that we may not use this for transport, salaries, or rental, etc., but only for our projects. It makes it very difficult for us to run projects without funding for transport and premises. We therefore do request funding specifically for these purposes.
- **FOR OUR OFFICE:**
 - Small **bar fridge**
 - Fans for summer time and gas heaters for winter. As we are in an industrial area the office gets very hot during summer and very cold during winter. We do have two front offices to the premises where we could fit an aircon as well.
